

On a financial note, we are in the last quarter of the year. While at this time our deficit is higher than we planned, we are hopeful that these last two months will see that reduce. Faith, Community Action Group:

At Paulin, we start the Advent season with White Gift Sunday on December 1st. The tradition of White Gift Sunday has its roots in a small Methodist church in Ohio in 1904. What began as a humble way to reflect on the love and devotion of the giver and not the value of the gift has grown into today's white gift services in many churches across several denominations. But rather than wrapping your gifts in white paper, please bring them in a White, Brown or Christmas gift bag. We will bring our gifts to the front of the church during the service. For our Gifts, we are once again collecting new items for Hiatus House (NO used or gently used items, please). Requested gifts include diapers (size 5 & 6), pullups, journals, day planners, adult colour books, pencil crayons, women's pajamas, personal care items (no travel size), pregnancy tests, boxes of chocolates, & throw blankets. Nonviolent toys for children such as LEGO, Magformers, Klutz toys, board games, play-doh, Barbie, Lite Hawk, Fisher-Price little people Leapfrog, Vtech & stuffed animals. Any cheque donations must be made out to Hiatus House and not Paulin. We are no longer collecting Gift Cards.

More than 40% of Canadian Women experience intimate partner violence at some point in their lives. Hiatus House provides services to support women and their children who leave these relationships. A recent development is the iHEAL app, which can be used by women to find personalized ways to stay safe and healthy while getting their basic needs met and reclaiming their power. Hiatus House also provides the Fresh Start program for men to help them understand, take responsibility for, and end abusive behaviour. Ending Intimate Partner Violence begins with Men.

Thanks to everyone who donated food bank items during November and to Kim Burgess who dropped them off at Our Lady of Guadalupe Roman Catholic Church. While food charity plays a role in the dealing with challenge of food insecurity, in 2025, we will be adding a letter-writing campaign to support increases to the Ontario Disability Support Program. Stay tuned for more information in February. In January, we will have the popular Pew Challenge for the Soup Shack. People in the pews on the minister's side are asked to donate underwear (size small and medium) and people on the choir side are asked to donate socks. 
